
Message of Gladness: A Millennial Anthem Overview by Sterling D. Allan, 228033 March 20, 2023 In 1997, I put some scripture references my dad compiled to music to perform for my parents' mission farewell to the Ivory Coast. It's my best musical composition to date. My parents listened to it often during their mission. It takes ~ 6.5 minutes to perform, and is written for two choirs, with counter-part melodies and harmonies. It's very difficult for me to play on the piano, and covers mearly every key. I anticipate that it will be a Favorite anthem in the soon-to-come Millennium. During my 7 years in prison, I often sing the tenor solo in the shower, and am preparing to perform it in an upcoming talent show. Enclosed are (A) the sheet music and (B) my dad's 9/19/2022 blog article about the piece and (C) links to audio files of the farewell, in segments. I made a pretty good recording of the piano accompaniment, with me singing the melody and some harmony, for a Christmas album that year. Once we find one of those CDs, we can upload the MP3 for download from my dad's blog article. I have to say that I'm finding it very gratifying lenjoyable practicing the piano accompaniment again, getting this anthem ready to go for the soon-to-emerge kingdom of heaven on earth/man child (Isa. 66:7; JST-Rev. 12:3,7; Isa. 42:4) Sterling D. The Message of Gladness by David W. Allan



My wife, Edna, and I served a year and a half mission in Cote d'Ivoire, West Africa, in 1997-99 for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Our theme for our mission was "The Message of Gladness" as we worked with the Saints and the wonderful people there.

The following is a summary of our amazing and unusual Missionary Farewell experience.

A Special Musical Composition

In preparation for our farewell, scheduled for July 1997 I asked our oldest son, Sterling, who was living with us at the time and was a very good pianist and composer, to prepare some music for us around the inspired architecture of the Washington D. C. Temple.

At the end of May, I was scheduled to go to Boulder, CO, to teach at their annual time and frequency seminar. Time was running out and we had not seen much progress with the composition. I asked Sterling if he wanted a priesthood blessing, and he said, "Of course, I would appreciate that." It was a sweet blessing, and when we came back over a week later, we witnessed a miracle, as he had pretty much finished this amazing composition that my wife named, **THE MESSAGE OF GLADNESS.**

I had provided the lyrics from the scriptures, which had a latter-day, Zion, millennial flavor to them. We had people coming from four states to our farewell, and they wanted to participate in the choir, so we made cassette tapes and gave them to those who wanted to take part. It was a very difficult piece, and Sterling was the only one who could play the piano for it.

A good friend, Al Stumphy, had agreed to be our conductor for this difficult piece of music, as we practiced with our ward choir. Actually, we only had one practice with all the family and friends from out of state and within the State of Utah that Sunday morning of our farewell.

We had 28 people who stayed in our home the Saturday night before. It was quite a gathering. We were to go into the mission home on Edna's birthday, 27 August 1997, where we would spend two months learning French. Try that one at 61 years of age!

After our practice the morning of the farewell, I got sick and I couldn't talk. I received a priesthood blessing and was healed almost instantaneously.

We were so pleased with the tremendous support and for all who came to that sacrament meeting and farewell for us. My brother, Dean, and my sister, Jeanne, gave the opening and closing prayers.
