1/11 Theophany Launch of Timeline

On 1/6, I mailed an article, "1/11 'New Moon' Window for Timeline Launch" based on the timeline I set forth in my 12/25/23 piece, "New Year's Timeline for New World Launch," adding 10 days to each of the seven key events that began on 1/1 in that timeline. I've been told that one (12/25 piece) is posted in the blog at IndComing.org. The 1/6 article came back yesterday because the officer didn't put his # on the money transfer form for postage. (i.e. it wasn't tp'd as I'd prayed it would be.)

This morning, I tabulated the ASCII sum of "1/11/24" = 367. That's also the ASCII sum of "tp'd". At a minimum, that suggest that in order for this 1/11 Theophany launch of the timeline to occur, then this present piece needs to be tp'd to Tudor. That doesn't just depend on me. It depends on her as well — how well she's accepted what she's seen of my material/paradigm. It also depends on how close society is to rock bottom collapse. Have we reached the "nick of time" point, beyond which it would be too late?

After I began this article, I noticed something for the first time — I noticed it's seeming relevance. Most of the time, as I've been writ-

these articles involving Tudor's resonance with this unfolding, I've had the wikipedia article about Tudor Dixon that Mary printed out for me. The bottom, right corner has "1/11" printed on it: first of 11 pages (landscape orientation). In the present context, 3.5 inches below Tudor's photo, this shows resonance, synchronistically with this 1/11 theophany launch of the timeline.

Page 367 of Str:07 has these super-relevant entries: "Finding & Finest Finger Finished." One of the def. #s translated "Finish" is 61615 - one digit removed from 1605 the ASCII sum of "Tudor Dixon-Allan". Another is H3607, which has "367" embedded. Note that 367 is a transposition of 376, the ASCII sum of "HMITE". Another is H3615, which has "365" embedded - the number of days in a year, which is consistent with the 1/11 timeline being based on the 1/1 timeline set forth in the 12/25 article.

The "Fine" entry is ^{mainly} def. # H5560, including the digits 560, which is the ASCII sum of "all in".

I also have noted that nearby "Finish H3615" is the def. "H3618 wife, bride."

I was going to only briefly mention the autonym relevance of OT & NT def.s 367 and vicini-

ly, but then I remembered that a big reason for my doing these AB studies is to bolster my own Faith, and I certainly need such bolstering.

The antonyms relate to (A) the destructions we avert by evoking the r.c.; (B) the key Marxist conspirators will ^{away (if they don't repent)} tip to a parallel planet that has hot rock bottom; and (C) ditto for the key Terrorists.

In going back through my journal notes, I made a significant connection. On 1/6, I noted that it was on p. 2212 of my journal that I began my AB studies on Tudor on 11/24, the day she was guest host on Clay and Buck's radio show. That number jumped out at me today when I was looking at p. 367 of Str.'07, ² but I couldn't remember why. Now I do. "Fine [Finger] ² #2212." That exact number.
