

Tudor Dixon's Address in Alphabetics

Last Feb., I realized that the P.O. Box 21085 address I had been using for Tudor was apparently no longer valid, receiving a letter back as undeliverable. So, I asked Mary if she would see if she could locate a valid mailing address. It took a couple of weeks before she relayed to me on 2/27 what she had found. On 3/1, I tabulated the ASCII sum of "Tudor Dixon; 6912 Windflower Way; Muskegon, MI 49444" = 4254. That's quite close to 4241 = "Bringing the King (& Queen) down of Heaven to Earth" — the title for the packet I've been preparing to send to Tudor, for which I needed to obtain an address.

The next morning, I think it was around 9 am, I had the impression to look up the ASCII sum of "She lives here." ^{= 1365} and that it would tie in to her address. It does. ~~It's~~ It's one away from "Muskegon, MI 49444" = 1364. That meant a lot to me — that this concise string came to mind, and that it tied in in this way.

(3/22) As for AB trees, OT def. H4254 (the ASCII sum of the whole address) derives from H2502. That number is a play on the previous person address (P.O. Box 250) in Draper, prior to our move to the new person. So, the new person is "250-2" (the second). And

"from H2502" relates to my pending packet to Tudor coming from this new person. H4254 means, "a mantle (as easily drawn off [Move]): - changeable suit of apparel, change of raiment." In the context of an address, this relates to the transient nature of addresses from an eternal vantage point.

NT def. ⁶H4254, though not directly includes the word "place," which has obvious relevance to an address. And relating to this mission, it conveys the notion of stepping forward:

- G4254 to lead-forward (magisterially [+MITF]); to precede (in place or time): - bring (forth [the kingdom of heaven to earth], out), go before.

That's the second def. on p. 1664 Str. 07, which is the ASCII sum of "stepping forward". The word "forward" appears ~~#~~ 14 times on the page, including "G4260 to walk forward; G4262 something that walks forward; G4298 to drive forward; G4311 to send forward: - accompany, bring (forward)..."

The def. just after G4254 is

- G4255 to choose for oneself before another thing (prefer), i.e. to propose (intend) [to become bride]: - purpose [r.c., KOFH2E]

In line with AB specificity, a transposition of 1663 = "stepping forward" is 1636 = "6912 Wind-flower Way" (w/o hyphen).
