

Noah Offered the Repentance Clause Option to His People in the Book of Jasher (5:7,8)

My inmate friend, Sam Ziwa showed this passage to me from the Apocalyptic Book of Jasher 5:5-9 that contains repentance clause (r.c.) wording for his day. They didn't have to go to destruction. They failed. I believe we're going to succeed—averting the literal baptism of fire of the earth, receiving the baptism of fire of the Holy Ghost instead.

“5. And all who followed the Lord died in those days, before they saw the ^[destruction] evil which God declared to do upon the earth.

6. And after the lapse of many years, in the four hundred and eightieth year of the life of Noah, when all those men, who followed the Lord had died away from amongst the sons of men, and only Methuselah was then left, God said unto Noah and Methuselah, saying,

2. Speak ye, and proclaim to the sons of men, saying, Thus saith the Lord, return from your evil ways and forsake your [evil] works, and the Lord will repent [change mind] of the evil [destruction/flood] that he declared to do to you, so that it shall not come to pass [being averted by repentance].

8. For thus saith the Lord, Behold I give you a period of one hundred and twenty years; if you will turn to me and forsake your evil ways, then will I also turn away from the evil [destruction] which I told you, and it shall not exist, saith the Lord.

9- And Noah and Methuselah spoke all the words of the Lord to the sons of men, day after day, constantly speaking to them.

10. But the sons of men would not hearken to them, nor incline their ears to their words, and they were stiffnecked.

In contrast, I see people today repenting. We're on track to pull off the r.c.
