The Spectrum Between Good and Evil

In today's polarized world, labels fly around recklessly. Some of the most common include: Commie, Racist, White Supremacist, Liberal, Conservative, MAGA, Progressive. When a person self-identifies as one of those, they own it proudly and openly. "I'm Progressive," or "I'm a Conservative." On the other extreme, a Progressive does not like being labeled a Commie; nor does a Conservative like being labeled a Racist. On the other end of the spectrum, a good example of this projection is illustrated by Jesse Kelly (Show.com), one of my favorite "Conservative" hosts, though there are several key areas where I view things very differently. He uses the "Commie" label very boldly to

describe those who are seeking to destroy the foundations of freedom in order to bring in a Marxist "utopia" cradle-to-grave socialist control in which in actuality the ruling elite are wealthy while everyone else is equal in gross poverty and depravity. The promises never realized because it is based on lies. Jesse is getting pointing these things out:

Ironically, he also epitomizes the projection phenomenon. He wants of a coming right-wing dictator, while embodying the very attributes that are likely to manifest the very thing he is warning about. He lacks the "love your enemy" admonition of Christianity. He advocates against being gentle in political activism. He says things along the lines of "It's working for them. Maybe we should do the same, so they stop winning."

But as I watch mainstream news, such as NBC, I see marvelous human beings who love what they do. Yes, they voice some lies of propaganda, but most of them actually believe the lies. They didn't contrive the lie. They've bought in.

As I reflected on this last night, Almar 12:44:11 came to mind as being relevant, which I did discuss last night with my celly. While reading this, apply it to the spectrum with the extremes of freedom on one hand relating to knowing in full, and the Marxist dictatorship on the other hand relating to the
