

Alphabetics Legitimacy



I realize that in my recent None to One book announcement (available at [IndComing.com](#)), I pushed the envelope perhaps beyond your comfort zone. In the 8-page announcement and in the book, I used the Alphabetics (AB) code I discovered in March 1996 that is based primarily on the alphabetical sequence of words and the numbers associated with them, especially in the Bible (esp. Strong's Concordance).

Here, I'd like to set forth^{briefly} what I consider indisputable points that establish AB as a solid, divinely-ordained tool. As you read these, ask yourself if they are indeed legitimate and indisputable.

- Lord/God = first & last, alpha & omega. (e.g. Isa. 41:4; Rev. 1:11...)
- First Bible def. = "H 1 Father." (Strong's)
- It's spelled I X aleph, bet.
- That's also the Hebrew word for "alphabet."
- So, the Heb. word for "father" & "alphabet" are essentially the same.
- This equivalency is also testified of in Eph. 3:14,15,
 "--- Of whom [the Father] the whole family in heaven and
 earth is named" (via alphabets).
- Eph. 3:14,15 is on p. 1483 of the LOS Bible. The ASCII sum of "Heavenly Mother" = 1483.
- OT def.  H 1483 is on p. 1483 of Strong's 2007 (ISBN 978-1-59856-378-8).

BTW, the book's serious erratum have been remedied. I'd recommend that you begin by reading the 13-pp Appendix B-1, "Societal Tipping Points," so you can see (A) we're on the same page; (B) my foreseer wisdom on these points probably exceeds any one else's.
