A Prisoner Can Save the World—Joseph

On 2/25, as I was preparing the 70 copies of the typebook announcement, I was contemplating/weighing whether to write "Who said a prisoner can't save the world? [through Jesus Christ]" — Joseph at the top, right of the doc, turned 90° to the right, in red ink. I tabulated the ASCII sum of that string (including the quotes, the two-hyphen-dash, a space before & after the dash), which comes to 678. Divided by 10 and rounded = 678.

Page 678 WOT opens with these relevant def.s/strings, starting with this opening string (finishing the def. "slam" from the previous page):

- duced by an impact. [save the world]
- slammer n. Slang Jail or prison.
- slander [marred reputation of prisoners generally]
- slang Informal language that contains made-up words or common words used in a different or uncommon way. [AB used extensively both in the announcement and the book.]

The strong AB resonance here both assured me that I should use that statement as well as affirmed the verity of the sentiment as it relates to me.
