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Timeline Launch Pushed Back One Day to Today, Tudor Tuesday?

I so loved the 1/1 Timeline launch sequence for the seven key events, each on succeeding days of the week, consecutive for the first five, then adding a week and a day for the Pentecost event, followed by two weeks and a day for the Wedding; all starting on Monday, 1/1; then Tue, 1/2; wed. 1/3, etc... So easy to remember, and so tightly aligned.

Since the 9:25 pm tp for the launching theory did not occur last night, I've been ~~part~~ puzzled, mulling over, "what now? /next? /when? /how aligned?"

At Gilban, I had their strong impression /realization, "Timeline schedule is still solid. Can be applied to start when ♀ is ready." A few minutes later, I added, "Starting on Monday of week; 9:25."

At 6:56, I looked up "Launch(ed)" in Strong's. The entry immediately before it is "Laugh(ed, ing...)", reminding me of the truism about God laughing when we have a plan/schedule pinned down.

The def. for "Launched" is 6:321, which years ago I had noted is in a countdown: 3-2-1. blast-off. It also angered me because its reminiscent of the 12/31/23 — 123123 unusual / unique numbering of New Year's Eve — blast-off

coming on 1/1 — which is now gone, without anything to show for it — no show, failure to launch. The rocket's still on the launch pad, but no launch occurred.

Then, around 8:25 am, I noticed something huge and had a realization of a possible variation on the theme. There's just one instance of "Launch" in the Bible, and it's given as Gr1877. I just now (8:52) looked at the scripture ref given? "Lk 5:4 said un- to Simon, L out into the deep Gr1877" That certainly parallels the rocketry & outer space metaphor that relates to trying to another planet for the theophany.

Anyway, what I noticed on Gr1877 is it is one digit removed from 1977 — the year you were born, pointing to you, specifically. The one digit removed points to the notion of the launch being pushed back one day, to start on Tuesday — Tudor Tuesday — instead.

I've not on 12/23, when I tallied the resonance for starting the timeline on diff. days of the week, Tue (& Thu wed) came in second-most resonant at 2.57, compared to the 2.8 I'd tallied for starting on Mon.

So, I'm going to drop this in the mail, now, and pray (Heb. 10:5) that it will be tried to you, so we can launch this thing at 9:25 am. If not ^{then,} then 9:25 pm. Sooner would be better, to have the full day for the theophany, not a few minutes.
